SUMMER SESSION

Students who are admitted to any Stanford Summer programs will receive an admission email, complete with instructions on how to proceed with the acceptance process. The admission email will include a link to the Program Handbook, which contains information specific to the program the student will be attending, as well as required acceptance documents. Students must complete and submit all required materials within the time period stated on the documents. At that point, students will receive their Stanford ID number and be eligible to enroll in courses.

Undergraduate & Graduate Students from Other Universities

Stanford Summer Session invites undergraduate and graduate students from around the world, the opportunity to enroll in courses and earn credit at one of the nation's world-class universities. Students in our program build their own schedule from over 175 courses offered in 35 departments within the schools of Humanities and Sciences, Earth Sciences, and Engineering. Courses offered feature accessible instructors, small class sizes, and a diverse student body.

Credit earned may be eligible for transfer to another college or university.

Undergraduate and graduate students may attend Stanford Summer Session as residential or commuting students

International Students

International students must arrive on campus by June 23, 2012 to be in compliance with F-1 Student Visa requirements.

Stanford University requires students to submit TOEFL or IELTS scores as part of the admission process for the Undergraduate & Graduate Summer Programs, and provides the following guidelines for students who have taken these tests. The minimum scores listed should help you to assess your readiness to spend a summer at Stanford. In some cases, the Program Director might arrange for a Skype interview with you.

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

- Minimum score of 223 for the computer-based TOEFL test (CBT)

- Minimum score of 85 for the internet-based TOEFL test (IBT)
- Minimum Score of 573 for the paper-based TOEFL test (PBT)

Or

International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

- Minimum overall band score of 6.5

Program Fees and Expenses

The Summer Session Office has created the following table to assist students in calculating their total summer costs. These estimates are based on a 3-unit tuition charge for domestic commuter students or international commuter students who do not require a Stanford-sponsored I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant F-1 Student Status), and an 8-unit tuition charge for international students with a Stanford-sponsored I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant F-1 Student Status) enrolled as either residential or commuter students. Both estimates are calculated at the undergraduate rate.
