

Young Scholars Program

The University of Pennsylvania's College of Liberal and Professional Studies offers a special opportunity for academically exceptional local high school students to take college courses with Penn students and earn full college credit. Young Scholars can pursue their favorite discipline beyond the level offered in secondary schools, get a head start on their college requirements, or explore a brand new field that interests them.

Eligibility

The Young Scholars program is open to high school juniors and seniors. It is not designed for younger students or for students who have been admitted to Penn through the Early Decision option.

Our average applicant has:

- At least a 3.3 G.P.A.
- Scores in the 85th percentile or greater in all sections of their standardized tests (SAT, PSAT, ACT)
- Writing that shows both technical skill and intellectual depth
- Strong recommendations UNITED STATES
- A variety of extracurricular interests

Curriculum

Young Scholars can choose from a variety of <u>courses</u> at the undergraduate level offered by the College of Liberal and Professional Studies. Topics offered include anthropology, economics, English, math, philosophy, linguistics, psychology, and many more. We encourage students to select courses based upon their interests rather than upon requirements or anticipated majors. We find that the students who fare best in our program are those who use this opportunity to expand and explore.

Enrollment is subject to the approval of the program director and registration in a desired course is not guaranteed.

Application Essays

Please respond to the following questions. Responses should not exceed two (2) pages in length for all the questions combined.

- 1. Have you ever been placed on probation, dismissed or suspended from any school, college, or university for reasons pertaining to academic integrity? If yes, please include any facts that you believe bear on the significance of this circumstance. If this does not apply, please write N/A in your response.
- 2. Describe your recent educational history (past 3-4 years) and background, making sure to address whether your transcripts accurately reflect your academic ability. Feel free to describe any non-academic or extra-curricular experiences that you feel strengthen your application, such as: volunteer work, employment, sports teams, high school clubs, and/or travel.
- 3. Briefly describe your academic and personal goals and explain how these will be furthered by study in the Young Scholars Program at Penn. Feel free to discuss a specific academic topic you enjoy studying and explain why it is of interest to you.
